THE LAND COMMISSION.

This morning at half-past nine o'clock Sir George Young, Bart., Secretary of the Land Commission, who arrived in Ennis last evening, sat at the Queen's Hotel, pursuant to notice, for the purpose of receiving from landowners or farmers any information they may be desirous to impart as a guide to the commissioners as a body for the future holding of an inquiry for Clare county, by desire of the Government. The regulation limited the interview to single individuals in turn, but there was no necessity, as neither a landlord or tenant appeared at the threshold. It is known that the Clare Land League disconvene the giving of evidence, and the landlords or their tenants will not come forward until the full inquiry is opened. Sir George left for Limerick by the 12 train.
