Cuffs and Sons Report.—With nearly 1,200 beasts and about 700 sheep less at market than the numbers shewn last week, our trade for both beef and mutton opened briskly to-day; every description of beast easily making 20s (and in some instances 30s), over last week's prices, while mutton sold generally at an advance of 4d per lb. Prime beef 65s to 70s per cwt; secondary and inferior 60s to 65s per cwt; prime wether 10d per lb; ewe 8 1/2d to 9 1/2d per lb. Beasts 1758, sheep 4,570.
