By the Lords Justices-General and Governors of Ireland

MONCK.

EDWARD SULLIVAN, M.R.

WHEREAS in many parts of Ireland a system of intimidation, whereby divers of Her Majesty's subjects, under apprehension of violence to their persons, or loss of their properties, or deprivation of the means of their livelihood, or loss of business, are coerced—

To give up their lawful employments;
 To abandon their lawful occupations and pursuits;
