

OF THE ARCHBISHOP OF TUAM.

Most Rev. John M'Hale, who died on Monday, 27th September, 1851, was born in 1791 at Tubbercavine, Mayo. He learned the rudiments of Greek and Latin in the neighbouring town of Castlebar, and was educated as a student at Maynooth, where he was a lecturer and Professor of Dogmatic Theology. Having held his professional office for about eleven years, he was appointed Coadjutor Bishop of Killala. In 1825, while resident in Maynooth he published under the pseudonym of "Hierophilus" a series of controversial letters on the Protestant Church in Ireland and Roman Catholic Emancipation; and in 1827 a work on "The Evidences and Doctrines of the Catholic Church," which has been since translated into the French and German languages. Dr M'Hale afterwards published a series of letters on the same class of subjects which attracted great attention both among the friends and the foes of Emancipation. On the death of Dr Kelly Dr M'Hale was promoted Archbishop of Tuam. Dr M'Hale was known as a preacher, not only in Ireland and Italy, but in Rome in 1832 have been translated into Italian at Vienna. He was introduced into Irish and published above sixty popular hymns and melodies, in the same precise metre as the original, in 1851 he produced a large volume comprising six books of the "Iliad," with a corresponding Irish translation in heroic verse, and published the Pentateuch in English.
