The Canadian distillery-fed cattle are expected in large numbers. Prices in America have declined, and freights are lower. Beef, 7d to 9d, and mutton, 9d to 9½ per lb; lambs, 8s to 6s each. There were 341 cattle and 5,093 sheep at market.
