The news from Zululand is still pregnant with anarchy and bloodshed. Cetewayo's territory has been twice invaded by Usibepu's impis, with what result in the way of slaughter we may only infer. In several minor engagements, at least, the invaders were successful. The King's movements and intentions are for the moment unknown. It is intended to take the Committee on the Scotch Tenant Compensation Bill immediately after the Committee on the English Bill. An important discussion is expected on the question of the application of the Third Schedule to existing leases, a point of peculiar interest to Scotland, where the lease system generally prevails.
