AND COME INTO 1ST JANUARY

The Intermediate Education in pursuance and by virtue of the Education (Ireland) Act, 1878, in approval of His Excellency the SPENCER, Lord Lieutenant-Governor of Ireland, for the Act, made the following add effect and come into operation 1884:—

RULE 28 A.—The Board may award Money Prizes, not exceeding £3 in the Middle Grade, £3 in the Middle Grade, to a number not exceeding three in each Grade, respectively, who shall obtain the highest Marks in English Composition.

No Student shall be awarded a Prize who shall not have passed the examination in accordance with Rule 27.

RULE 28 B.—The Board may award Money Prizes, each not exceeding £3, to a number not exceeding the number of Students in each Grade, in the opinion of the Board, who shall be proficient in any one of the following branches of study:—

I.—Classics (Greek and Latin).

II.—Mathematics.

III.—English, together with French or German Language.

No such Prize shall be awarded to a Student who is not a Senior Scholar or winner of a Senior Scholarship.

No Student shall be awarded a Prize in any one year.

No Student shall be awarded a Prize who shall not have passed the examination in accordance with Rule 27.

No Student shall be awarded a Prize a second time in the same Grade.
