LIVERPOOL CATTLE, Monday.—The supply of stock was less than last Monday, and the demand for beef, mutton, and lamb was slow, at lower prices for each. A number of Canadian cattle from the London market had a depressing effect upon trade. Beef, 7d to 9d per lb; mutton, 9d to 9½d; lambs, 30s to 60s each. There were 759 cattle and 5,685 sheep in market.
