THE ELECTRIC LIGHT IN RAILWAY CARRIAGES. -An invention has been patented for applying the electric light to railway carriages. By this new contrivance electricity is generated by a primary battery, which can be carried underneath a railway carriage, or in any convenient part of a train. Among the merits claimed for the invention are the exceedingly low internal resistance of the battery, the facility with which it can be charged, and its freedom from noxious fumes. A trial of the system was made on the Great Northern line on Thursday afternoon, when the Pullman dining-car of the 5.40 express to Leeds was lit by six Swan incandescent lamps, supplied with electricity from one buttery of twelve cells, of the battery being-lenght 4ft,
