LWAY ACCIDENT IN CO. LEITRIM.
The Station Master at Glenfarne, Co Leitrim, a labourer named Gallagher were killed to-day by a train which was being shunted at that place. The Station Master whose name is O'Hara was killed with a wife and children.

THE TRADES' UNION CONGRESS.
Lord Rosebery, speaking to-day at the Trades' Union Congress, said the work of the Congress was most beneficial to the country, while their organization showed that labour was able to hold its own with profit and advantage. The example of the Union was one for the Empire, which he threatened to break up, and a day might come when the Colonies would ask why Governors should be sent to them from England. He feared we were allowing our Colonial empire to drift away. Lord Rosebery also condemned Government emigration, and thought emigration generally was a point for the trades unions to take up. Concluding he expressed a hope that the bonds of union between the different portions of the British Empire might be strengthened. A resolution was carried unanimously instructing the Parliamentary committee to assist trades societies in their efforts of forming a federation of trades' organizations.

CRICKET.

The match between the Australians and the England Eleven opened to-day at the Oval. England won the toss, and at 1.25 had made 43 runs for three wickets. Grace out for 24. Shortly before luncheon England were all out for 56. After O'Brien left, five wickets fell for 100 runs. The Australians, at four o'clock, had scored 48 for two wickets. Weather fine all day, and many spectators.

DUBLIN CATTLE, this day.—The numbers penned to-day were 2,993 cattle and 7,024 sheep. The supplies being considerably in excess of requirements, it was difficult to place anything of secondary quality, and prices were seriously affected. Beef, 55s to 67s 6d per cwt; mutton, 7d to 8d per lb. Pigs 35s to 46s per cwt. A large number of animals remained unsold.
LONDON CATTLE, this day.—490 beasts, 40 foreign, slow, at 4s to 5s 8d. 3,070 sheep, 70 foreign, quiet, at 5s to 6s 4d. 90 calves, at 5s to 5s 8d. Pigs quoted 3s 8d to 4s 8d per 8 lbs.

BRISTOL CATTLE, this day.—English beef short and of poor quality; best, 78s; middling sorts, 74s per cwt. Mutton plentiful and trade good; light weights, 8d to 9d; heavy ewes, 8d per lb. There was a superabundance of lamb which sold slowly at nominal rates. Pigs scarce; baconers, 10s, and porkers 11s per score. 1,700 store cattle from Ireland, and all sold at fair prices.
