

ated that she met the prisoner and another man, in custody, in Catherine-street, and they without any provocation assaulted her. The prisoner asked and otherwise assaulted her. The case was adjourned to Petty Sessions, and the magistrates allowed Kennedy out to appear on a summons. A few cases of drunkenness were disposed of on fines of 2s 6d and costs—Adjourned.

BRUFF QUARTER SESSIONS.

At these sessions yesterday, before Mr T A Russell, Q.C., County Court Judge, the following case was heard:—

The guardians of the Kilmallock Union, plaintiffs; C J Coote, defendant.

Mr P D Fleming, B.L., instructed by Mr Michael O'Donnell, for plaintiffs; and Mr William O'Shaughnessy, solicitor, for defendant.

The action was brought under the 11th and 12th Vict., c 47, s 2, to recover the penalty sum of £20, for evicting one Ellen Casey out of the lands of Ballinamoloug, on the 18th day of January, 1884, without giving notice, as required by the statute, to the relieving officer of the electoral district in which the lands were situated. Ellen Casey was tenant to Mr Coote, and was evicted for non-payment of a year and a half's rent, amounting to £223 10s, an ejectment having been brought by Mr Coote's agent against the tenant. Judgment was endorsed in the Common Pleas Division, and possession of the premises handed over to Mr W W Townsend, agent by the sheriff under a writ of *habere* on the 18th January, 1884. The lands were situated in the electoral division of Ardpatrik, Union of Kilmallock. Notice of the eviction was served on the relieving officer of the said division.

Mr F St C Hobson, sub-sheriff, examined by Mr Fleming, proved delivering possession to the tenant under the *habere*.

The tenant, Ellen Casey, proved the eviction, John Lyons, relieving officer of the electoral division of Ardpatrik, deposed that no notice of the eviction was served on him until after the eviction.

Cross-examined by Mr O'Shaughnessy—Had a conversation with a man named Cronin the day of the eviction; Cronin was relieving officer of the electoral division of Kilfinane; Cronin said he had got notice of the eviction, but forgot about it; he did not consider it his duty to report to the Board unless he got written notice himself.

His Lordship—Mr Fleming, do you close your case now? Yes, my lord—handing in the *libere*.

His Lordship—Well, I dismiss the case. You did not prove that the tenant was one of the destitute poor. I decided in another case that it is necessary.

Mr Fleming—It is not necessary. That case was before Judge Lawson on appeal, and the result of the case was decided on was that the written appointment of the relieving officer was not proved. I have proved all that is necessary.

The guardians entered an appeal.
