**A NARROW ESCAPE.**—A freak indulged in by a young soldier named Hugh Flanagan, of the Royal Artillery, stationed at Fort Westmoreland, was nearly costing him his life. He appears to have been drinking, and after roll call on Sunday night he reached the shore and, taking a small boat, attempted to cross over to Queenstown. The boat filled, and was being drifted to sea. He shouted, and a crew of a vessel anchored in the harbour put off to his assistance and rescued him in an exhausted state. He made some inconsistent statements about two young civilians having accompanied him and been drowned, but these statements he afterwards contradicted.
