There were 36 animals attacked with pleur-
pneumonia in Ireland during the week ending
24 h inst. Of these, 14 cases occurred in the
North Dublin Union, 18 in the South Union,
and 4 in Rathdown, so that the disease is con-
fined to the neighbourhood of Dublin. All the
animals attacked, except one, were killed.
Swine fever during the same period amounted to
20 cases. 261 sheep were declared infected with
scab, there being 244 affected in Leinster, 17 in
Munster, while Ulster and Connaught were com-
pletely free.

The Globe says—Some day a marvellous story
will be told—the story of the City of Glasgow
Bank failure. Most of the assets were taken over
by a company, in order that they might be
advantageously realised; and so successful
has the operation been that the report
issued last night shows a profit of £40,747,
enabling a dividend of 7 per cent to be declared.
Altogether, £217,709 has been "recovered," and
as many of the shares in the company were
taken up on behalf of the unfortunate bank
shareholders, it seems probable that in course of
time a great part of the lost six millions may
come back to them.
