**DEATH OF COLONEL PHIBBS, LATE OF THE ROYAL IRISH FUSILIERS (87TH).**—Colonel Phibbs died on Sunday morning, after a very brief illness, at his residence, Aldowen House, near Sligo. He had served with distinction in this gallant Irish corps, having been through one of the Egyptian campaigns under Lord Wolseley. He was at one time appointed Adjutant to the Sligo Militia when it was a rifle Corps, and retired from the army with the brevet rank of Lieutenant-Colonel. He then came to reside in Sligo, where his late father, Mr William Phibbs, of Seafield, held a prominent position. The deceased gentleman had just begun to make himself very useful as a member of the Sligo public bodies, when he was suddenly called away by an acute attack of heart disease, at the comparatively early age of 40 years.
