FUNERAL OF MR. HENRY LYONS, D.L.

The funeral of this much lamented gentleman,
whose unexpected death we announced in our last
issue, took place to-day at Croom, and was at-
tended by a large number of the neighbouring
gentry, whilst nearly every person in the de-
ceased's native village was present to pay the last
tribute of respect to his memory, his tenantry
and employes assembling in great numbers. The
cortege left Croom House at 10.30 o'clock, the re-
