

SAD ACCIDENT TO A YOUNG LADY.—On Thursday night a sad burning accident occurred to Miss Hardy, daughter of Mr Hardy, C.E, Bessbrook. It appears that Miss Hardy went into the kitchen of her father's house to give instructions as to some domestic arrangements, and not finding the servant there she went forward to close the range and to remove something from it, when the draft drew a portion of her dress into contact with the fire, and in a moment the young lady was enveloped in flames. Her screams brought the servant to her assistance, and when she saw her mistress in flames she ran and procured a sheet, with which she extinguished the flames by enveloping her in it. A messenger was at once despatched for medical assistance, and when Dr Clarke arrived and made an examination he found that the young lady was severely burned about the limbs and body, and also her right hand. The usual remedies were applied, and although Miss Hardy is suffering considerable pain, she is in no immediate danger.
