**LAW INTELLIGENCE.**

**COURT OF APPEAL—YESTERDAY.**

*Doherty v. Haugh.*

This was an appeal from the Exchequer Divi-  
sion. The plaintiff brought two actions on foot  
of two promissory notes for £160 against each of  
the two defendants, Thomas and Michael Haugh.  
Before the year 1876 Thomas Haugh, one of the  
defendants, held a farm at Kilrush under the  
plaintiff at a rent of £25 per annum. The rent  
was largely in arrear, a sum of £320 being due  
to the plaintiff. Ejectment proceedings were  
about to be instituted, but in 1876 an agreement  
was entered into by which the farm was divided  
between Thomas, the former tenant, and his  
brother Michael, on their signing each a pro-  
missory note for £160 to the plaintiff, Mr Do-  
herty. After the passing of the Arrears Act the  
brothers, Thomas and Michael, supported the  
applications made in the Arrears Court, and the  
result was that the plaintiff got one year's rent  
from the Land Commission under the
