THE LAND PURCHASE BILL.—The *Standard* says—It is rumoured that the Land Purchase Bill will propose to throw the task of collecting the revenues from the land after the expropriation of the landlords upon the Imperial Board, which, if the Land Scheme is adopted, will be constituted for the collection of the Excise duties. This Board would be responsible for the annual contribution to the Sinking Fund, and for the repayment of the advance made from the Imperial Exchequer. This would be a charge not merely upon the money raised from the land, but upon the whole of the revenue of the Board after the payment of Ireland's share of Imperial taxation out of the Excise. Any loss from the non-payment of rent would fall upon the Exchequer.

TELEGRAPHING MR GLADSTONE'S SPEECH.—The Press Association says—That a rough estimate made by the Post Office authorities shows that the number of words signalled out of London on Thursday on the occasion of Mr Gladstone's Irish Government statement was about 1,500,000.
