CONFERRING HONOURS BY THE UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

Dr Oliver Wendell Holmes had honorary degrees conferred on him by the University of Cambridge to-day. The ceremony took place at the usual hour, and after a formal speech in which the students called for an address from the President, he did not respond.
