ASTROLOGY AND TORPEDO BOATS.—The Court astrologer (says the Constantinople correspondent of the *Times*) having declared the conjunction of the celestial bodies unfavourable for launching the torpedo boat last Monday week, the ceremony was postponed to Friday last, when the combination of stars was more propitious. The launch took place on that day successfully in the presence of the high officials of the navy, and the boat was tried on the Golden Horn, giving full satisfaction in every respect. This is the first naval construction of a special kind in the Turkish dockyard, assigned to and carried out by an English engineer, Mr Baron, formerly of the Thames Ironworks. He has, however, left the Turkish service, with other Englishmen, finding the treatment accorded him unsatisfactory in respect of pay, and of the jealous intrigues of his subordinates. A second boat on the same lines is in course of construction.
