Thursday 30—Tipperary: Bacha, Carrick-on-Suir. Clare: Kiltrush. Kerry: Killorglin.

In places marked thus (*) a pig fair is held on the day previous.

Mallow Monthly Cattle Market is held on the first Tuesday of each month.

Ennis monthly fair is held on the first Saturday of every month.

Kilkee Fairs—5th October, 26th November, 24th February, second Tuesday in January, and third Monday in April, each year. There is also a monthly market for the sale of pigs held on the second Tuesday of each month.

Fairs are held in the city of Limerick on the first and third Tuesday of every month for pigs, and on the first Thursday of every month for cattle and sheep; and in the city of Cork on the first Thursday of every month.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Sir Charles Warren has issued an order to the Metropolitan Police directing the prosecution under the Police Act of cab and luggage touters who annoy travellers in London by following cabs and omnibuses.

The Local Government Board have sanctioned the application of Richmond Vestry for power to borrow fifteen thousand pounds for the purpose of purchasing the estate of the Duke of Buccleugh on Richmond Hill, so as to convert it into pleasure grounds and preserve the view. The Vestry may borrow the money for fifty years.

At Burton-on-Trent to-day, Arthur Gamb Brewer's traveller, and Thomas H Sykes, brewer both of Burton, were each fined £5 and costs for riotous and violent behaviour in the Salvation Army barracks during service, on the 23rd inst. Both defendant's pleaded guilty by their solicitor's advice.

A fire was raging this afternoon at Roach Mill Heywood, Lancashire. It broke out in a spinning room.

Admiral Lyons, who succeeds Earl Clanwill in command of the North American squadron sailed from Portsmouth to-day in the troopship Himalaya with Captain Beaumont and crew for her Majesty's ship Canada.

A woman named Davies, wife of a pot hawker has been remanded at Burslem, Staffordshire on a charge of drowning her child, age 4 years in an earthenware basin.

A new cattle market which has been erected at a cost of thirty thousand pounds was opened at Nottingham to-day by the Mayor. An accommodation is provided for twenty thousand head of cattle.
