BRISTOL CATTLE MARKET. This Day—Beef in moderate supply, but sufficient for trade. Good steers, 50s; cows 48s to 54s. Sheep also in moderate supply. Trade slow, wethers, 8d; ewes, 6d to 7d; 1,200 pigs, baconers, 8s 6d to 8s 9d; porkers, 1s to 10s; nothing doing in store cattle.

Mallow Monthly Cattle Market is held on the first Tues, day of each month.
Ennis monthly fair is held on the first Saturday of every month.
Kilkee Fairs—24th February, second Tuesday in January, and third Monday in April, each year. There is also a monthly market for the sale of pigs held on the second Tuesday of each month.
Fairs are held in the city of Limerick on the first and third Tuesday of every month for pigs, and on the first Thursday of every month for cattle and sheep; and in the city of Cork on the first Thursday of every month.
