

DUBLIN CATTLE. Market here this morning, only 173 cattle and 1,06 sheep offered. Sales easily effected, principally for local consumption, at extreme figures. Beef, 45s to 51s per cwt; mutton, 6d to 8d per lb.

BRISTOL CATTLE. This Day—Quite a holiday market to-day, nothing doing except in pigs, and quotations would be entirely misleading. About 400 pigs arrive from Ireland, and these found purchasers, baconers at 8s 6d; porkers, 9s 0s to 10s per score.
