THE LATE DR. BRODIE.—The remains of the
late Dr Brodie, who died in Dublin on Wednes-
day, arrived in town by mail train to-day for
interment at Mount St Lawrence Cemetery.
Several members of the legal profession, and
a large number of other citizens attended the
funeral, to pay their last mark of respect to the
memory of a gentleman so well and favourably
known in Limerick. The clergy officiating at
the cemetery were—Rev Fathers Dundon and
O'Shaughnessy, C.C.

OUTRAGE—On yesterday morning at half-past
nine o'clock, as a man named Patrick Hayes,
agent on the O'Shaughnessy property at Bruree,
was returning from a neighbour's house in the
locality he was suddenly assaulted by a man named
Carroll, who, as alleged, bit the finger next the
thumb of his left hand. The assault is supposed
to have arisen out of some ill-feeling which ex-
isted between the parties. Informations were
taken from Hayes by Colonel Perse, and Car-
roll will be charged at next petty sessions.

MORTALITY STATISTICS.—The average annual
death-rate represented by the deaths registered
last week in the sixteen principal town districts
of Ireland was 23.8 per 1,000 of the population.
The deaths registered in the past week in the
several towns, alphabetically arranged, cor-
responded to the following annual rates per
1,000:—Armagh, 15.5; Belfast, 27.0; Cork, 20.8;
Drogheda, 12.7; Dublin, 23.2; Dundalk, 13.1;
Galway, 20.2; Kilkenny, 21.1; Limerick, 36.7;
Lisburn, 19.3; Londonderry, 25.0; Lurgan, 10.3;
Newry, 17.6; Sligo, 12.2; Waterford, 23.2;
Wexford, 25.7. The deaths from the principal
zymotic diseases in the 16 districts were equal to
an annual rate of 2.8 per 1,000, the rates varying
from 0.0 in in Limerick, Kilkenny, Drogheda,
Wexford, Sligo, Lisburn, Lurgan, and Armagh,
to 10.1 in Galway; the six deaths from all causes
registered in the last-named district comprising
