REMOVAL OF MR H. F. MYSTERIOUS DEATH NEAR TIPPERARY.—At half-past 10 o'clock on Tuesday night a man named Patrick Donohue, a shoemaker by trade, from Kilteely, County Limerick, was found lying in the dyke on the Bohercrown road, within a mile of Tipperary, dead. There were slight scratches on the face and neck. No other marks of violence could be seen. Donohue, who was some time in America, was about 45 years of age, and attended Tipperary fair on Tuesday. The police were at once communicated with, and proceeded to Bohercrown. They had the body removed to the workhouse mortuary.

AN EXCITING EVICTION IN KERRY.—At an eviction yesterday, at a place called Lishane, about six miles distant from Listowel, a determined resistance was made by the tenant and some friends. When the bailiffs, protected by forty policemen, arrived at the tenant's house he, with some five or six people, were in possession, and having barricaded the doors firmly, and retired to an apartment on the left, they then cut away the staircase. From this apartment, through the window, the tenant, Trant, told the sheriff that unless the agent yielded to his demand he would offer all the opposition he could to the eviction. A great crowd assembled, and as Mr Trant would not surrender the bailiffs and police had to effect an entrance by force. After a considerable time they succeeded in breaking down the barricades and effecting the eviction.
