DEATH OF MAJOR SCOTT, J.P-We regret to record the death of Major Scott, JP, Killaloe, which took place at his residence on Tuesday Major Scott was an English gentleman, but for thirty years he had been a resident on the banks of the Shannon, so pictures oue towards Killaloe. He interested himself very considerably in fishing, and was a valued member of the Fishery Board. The deceased gentleman was most popular with all classes and preeds for his many good qualities, and although he had arrived at the ripe age of 73 years his death is universally and deservedly regretted.

SUDDEN DEATH-INQUEST .- Mr Coroner De-Courcy held an inquest shortly after half-past one o'clock this afternoon, at St Michael's Lane, on the body of an old man named Thomas Gabbett, who was aged 60, and died suddenly last night, it was alleged, from heart disease. A respectable jury having been sworn, the wife of the deceased was examined and deposed that he went to bed at 10 o'clock last night, and died at 11; deceased had been complaining for some time past. A man named Reagh, Thomas Gabbett, nephew, and Mary Gabbett, niece of the deceased, were also examined and gave similar evidence. The jury returned a verdict that the deceased died from heart decease.
