GLASGOW CATTLE MARKET, April 7th—(Bells, Watson, and Robertson's Report).—The cattle supply in this market to-day was short of late numbers. The quality of the whole was excellent; demand good and prices higher. Best beef, 58s per cwt; secondary, 54s to 56s; inferior, 45s to 50s. There were also fewer sheep shown, which were in demand at firmer prices. Best sheep in wool, 7½d to 8d per lb; do clipped, 7d to 7½d; secondary, 7d to 7½d; inferior, 6½d. An easy clearance of all kinds was made.—At our weekly sale to-day we had 277 cattle and 280 sheep. Better prices were obtained for both. The former especially sold particularly well, with prices firmer at the close of the sale. Although there are two small lots of foreign cattle for next week, we do not think they will affect the price of home-fell stock to a very appreciable extent.
