**DEATH AT A WEDDING**—Mr Shirley, Coroner for the Southern Division of Kilkenny, has just held an inquest at Glencannon, near Piltown, on the body of Patrick Dunn, farmer, who died under the following painful circumstances :—It appeared in evidence that Dunn's daughter was on Thursday morning married to a sergeant in the Royal Irish Constabulary. The marriage ceremony was performed at the residence of the bride's father, who was present with his wife. During the ceremony he was observed by one of the company to suddenly drop his head as if he had fallen asleep, but no notice was taken of him. Immediately after the marriage the bride and bridegroom left for Fiddown railway station on the Waterford and Limerick Railway on their honeymoon. Some of the family, after the young people had left the house, went to rouse up their father, whom they found quite dead. The jury returned a verdict of death from natural causes.
