DUBLIN CATTLE MARKET, Thursday (L'Cuiffe and Sons' Report)—Although our number to-day were larger by 194 beasts and 456 sheep, yet, owing to the improved trade throughout the English markets, both beef and mutton sold briskly at an advance of from 10s to 20s per head on cattle and from 2s to 3s per head on sheep. Prime beef, 54s to 56s per cwt; secondary and inferior, 48s to 52s; mutton, 6d to 7½d per lb. 2,517 beasts, 4,950 sheep.
