THE IMPRISONMENT OF PARNELLITE JOURNALISTS.—The *Dublin Evening Mail* is informed that certain Parnellite members of the Association of Irish Journalists are urging the Council of the Association to convene a meeting of members to protest against the imprisonment of journalists under the Crimes Act. It is understood, however, that the Council have no power whatever to deal with the matter. It is necessary for the summoning of a meeting of members, that a requisition signed by a certain number of members, should be presented to the Council, would then have no other choice than to summon a meeting. No such requisition has in the present instance been presented, and as the matter in question is quite outside the duties for which the Council were elected by the association, no action can be taken by them.
