PIGS—Supply fair. Bacon pigs, 38/- to 00/-; demand steady. Berwick, 38/- per cwt.

AMERICAN BACON, 39s to 43s per cwt, smoked, 0/- to 0d per lb; Canadian, 7d per lb; Hams, 9d per lb.
