THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BIL Lord Randolph Churchill has given no the following new clauses to the Local G ment Bill: " (1 A) Every person who, I member, officer, or servant of any corpo council, board, commission, or other public whose expenses are wholly cr in part de out of local taxes, rates, or assessments, sh himself or by or in conjunction with an person, corruptly promise, solicit, pay, rece agree to pay or receive, by or for himself or for any other person, any gift, loa reward, advantage, or gratification whate respect of any contract, work, purchase or land or property, or any other matter or action, or proposed transaction, whatsoe which the public body of which he is a m officer, or servant is concerned, shall be of a misdemean ur.

" (2) Any member, officer, or servant board or other public body as aforesaid sh trial and conviction for misdemeanour unc Act, be liable, at the discretion of the court which he is convicted, to be imprisoned period not exceeding two years, with or v hard labour, or to any fine not exceeding and shall be incapable of being elected t upon, and if elected his election shall be ve board or other public body for seven year the date of his conviction; and in the eve second conviction for a like offence he sl addition to the foregoing penalties, be for incapable of serving upon any such be other public body, and his name shall be st the list of persons entitled to vote at a mentary of any other election; and an officer or servant in the employ of any sucl or public body by the fact of such conviction forfeit his right and claim to any compe or pension to which he would otherwis become entitled."
