**THE CLONCURREY ESTATE.**—With reference to rumours on the subject, Canon Wall, P P, Newport, has written to the *Freeman* contradicting the statement that "Lord Cloncurry had written to me offering to submit the dispute between himself and his tenants at Murroe to the arbitration of the Most Rev Dr O'Dwyer. Neither is it true that I have forwarded any letter from Lord Cloncurry to the Bishop of Limerick."

**DEATH FROM HEART DISEASE.**—A case of sudden death occurred in the city on Thursday morning. From the particulars it would appear that an old man, an Army pensioner, named John Reilly, aged about 50 years of age, had been ailing for some time past, suffering from heart disease. On Thursday morning, the police, acting on information received, went to his bedroom and found him dead. An inquest was held later on in the day by a jury, when a verdict of "death, caused by disease of the heart" was returned.

**BARRICADING HOLDINGS ON THE VANDELEUR ESTATE.**—At a Crimes Act Court held yesterday at Miltown Malbay, before Messrs Roche and Mercer, R M's, several persons were prosecuted for barricading the houses on the Vandeleur estate. Ten persons, tenants and caretakers, including four carpenters from Kilrush. Mr Doherty, jun, was sentenced to seven days for refusing to give the names of those ordering the timber for the barricading purposes. Dr Counsel, B L, defended.

**RATES IN THE KILMALLOCK UNION.**—At the weekly meeting of the Kilmallock Board of Guardians on Thursday, Mr P O'Shaughnessy in the chair, a number of farmers from the district of Kilfinane, with their solicitor (Mr Barry), attended, and complained of the high rates in that division.
