DEATH FROM HEART DISEASE.—A case of sudden death occurred in the city on Thursday morning. From the particulars it would appear that an old man, an Army pensioner, named John Reilly, aged about 50 years of age, had been ailing for some time past, suffering from heart disease. On Thursday morning, the police, acting on information received, went to his bedroom and found him dead. An inquest was held later on in the day by a jury, when a verdict of "death, caused by disease of the heart" was returned.

BARRICADING HOLDINGS ON THE VANDELEUR ESTATE.—At a Crimes Act Court held yesterday at Miltown Malbay, before Messrs Roche and Mercer, R M's, several persons were prosecuted for barricading the houses on the Vandeleur estate. Ten persons, tenants and caretakers, were sentenced to a month's imprisonment, including four carpenters from Kilrush. Mr Doherty, jun, was sentenced to seven days for refusing to give the names of those ordering the timter for the barricading purposes. Dr Counsel, B L, defended.
