THE FINANCIAL CONDITION OF LIMERICK—A committee appointed some time ago by the Corporation for the purpose of taking into consideration the present financial condition of the city, with a view of taking advantage of the recent Act of Parliament for the consolidation of loans to municipal bodies, and also to consider the debt due by the Market Trustees, and report thereon, was convened for to-day, but a quorum not attending, the proceedings had to be adjourned. The Mayor and Town Councillor M'Carthy were the only members present, together with the Town Clerk.
