THE LATE REV J. B. GILLMAN, LIMERICK.—A
memorial of the late Rev James B. Gillman, of
this city, in crown octavo, beautifully printed,
with a photograph and autograph of the deceased,
has been prepared and published by the Rev Dr
Crook, of Newry. Mr Gillman, who died on the
31st December, 1888, was the Demosthenes of
Irish Methodism, and probably one of the ablest
preachers the denomination ever produced. The
memory of such a man should not be allowed to
perish, and Dr Crook, who knew him well, has
conferred a benefit on Methodism by the timely
publication of this pamphlet, which contains the
sermon preached on the occasion of Mr Gillman's
death, and a full sketch of his life and character,
the whole extending to about 120 pages. It
should have an extensive circulation.
