SENTENCE ON MR JOHN POWELL.

At Birr, yesterday, Mr John Powell, editor of the *Midland Tribune and Tipperary Sentinel*, was sentenced to three months' imprisonment with hard labour, under the Crimes Act, for publishing an article intimidating tenants. The defendant said the farce of a trial need not have been enacted, as he knew that the sentence was not enacted, and dried. The magistrates described this as a gross contempt of court, and sentenced Mr Powell to a further term of seven days. The original sentence was appealed from, but for the contempt defendant was sent to Tullamore Jail.
