Mr. Churchill replied to Mr. Bradlaugh is considered the ablest contributor, and, amidst laughter, craved usually extended to new members of his silence. He affirmed his indisputable right of the Crown provision for the Royal Family, the right of her Majesty to rely with the liberality of the House. On the application of Lord John Russell for a grant of £12,000 per annum at Duke of Cambridge, he stated that the proposition was opposed not because the title of the Crown to the Civil List was questioned. He met the objection of Mr. Bradlaugh "that the Crown had no full and free possession of the Civil List," by a quotation from Mr. Disraeli, that her Majesty had as clear a complete a possession of those estates as could give her. He then passed on to the charge of those members who questioned the right of her Majesty to the balance of the Civil List, and declared that the challenge would amount to an accusation against the Treasury officials of aiding and abetting the embezzlement of public money by the Civil List should be referred to her Majesty's use, and that her Majesty should not apply to her privy purse any money from it. In connection with this subject Lord Randolph alluded to a speech made by Mr. Storey, in which he stated on his own knowledge that the Civil List of the Sovereign amounted to three millions of money, and declared such a statement made with the purpose of creating a charge of embezzlement; and further, Lord Randolph

FATAL ACCIDENT.—Mr M. J. DeCourcy, City Coroner, and a jury, held an inquest to-day on the body of a child named Helena Hurley, who succumbed to the effects of injuries received by being knocked down by a horse and cart at Wickham street, on the preceding evening. There was a charge against the driver, a man named Joseph M'Mahon, in the employment of Messrs Russell and Sons, of careless driving. It appeared from the evidence that the child was about three years old, and was crawling on the street when the occurrence took place. The conveyance was loaded with flour, the driver occupying a position on the top, and notification was not given in time to avert the accident. M'Mahon was remanded to Petty Sessions on bail.
