The Court unanimously dismissed the application with costs, holding that every question suggested by Mr Kenny had been fully gone into at the Sub-Commission and at the re-hearing at Ennis, and that there was no question of law to be argued.

The doctors who attended the late King of Portugal in his last illness have certainly not underrated the value of their services on that occasion, to judge by their bills. One of them demanded £2,400 for ten visits, another was content with £3,400 for eighteen, while a third thought that £5,000 was not much to pay for his presence at the same number of consultations. The medical fees came to over £12,000 in all, which the new King paid without a murmur, though possible not without a twinge.

SAVED FROM A BURNING SHIP.—The captain of the steamer Energie, which has arrived at New York from Bremen, reports that, while off Nantucket at noon on Monday she spoke the ship A J Fuller, bound from Liverpool to New York, which signalled that she had on board the crew and passengers of the steamer Santiago, which had been burnt at sea. All on board were saved. There appears to be no doubt that the steamer was the Santiago, which left New York on the 7th instant for Hull, as she was the only vessel of the name which the A J Fuller could have fallen in with at that point. She had on board two passengers and a crew of sixty hands.
