**DEATH OF MR. D. ADAMSON.**—The death is  
 announced of Mr Daniel Adamson, who was the  
 leading promoter of the Manchester Ship Canal  
 scheme during its Parliamentary struggles in the  
 years 1883-85. As chief of the firm of Messrs D.  
 Adamson and Co., he was largely concerned in  
 the introduction of Bessemer steel. He was  
 president of the Iron and Steel Institute in 1887,  
 and was a distinguished member of other me-  
 chanical and scientific associations. Born at  
 Shildon, in the County of Durham, in 1818, he  
 was 71 years of age at his decease, which took  
 place on Tuesday, after about a year's illness.  
 His early engineering experience was gained in  
 supervision of the works of the Stockton  
 and Darlington Railway. He was afterwards  
 manager of the Shildon Engine Works. Begin-  
 ning business on his own account in 1850, he  
 became engaged in several prosperous concerns.
