Stones, 4ft. in diameter, with all the neces-
sary silk dressing machines, and the latest new

Cork, (close bucket) 16ft. in diameter by 8ft. in
width, taking the water about one foot over the
centre.

necessary by a first class horizontal condensing
engine, worked by a tubular boiler of 80 horse-
power, very little used, and fully capable of
driving the whole mill.
