**THE SWIVEL BRIDGE.**—Our attention has been called to the great inconvenience which is caused to traffic through the re-flooring of the Swivel Bridge, which has now been in hands for some weeks. Since then all the vehicular traffic, which ordinarily goes over the bridge, goes round by the Englishtown, and it is hoped that the work will be completed as quickly as possible in order to obviate the delay which this round-about route entails.
