JUDICIAL RENTS.—A return of the number of cases in which judicial rents have been fixed by Sub-Commissions under the Land Law Act, 1881, during October, 1889, has been issued. It shows that in Ulster the number was 98, in Leinster 17, in Connaught 65, and in Munster 8. The acreage in Ulster was 1,228a 3r 26p; in Leinster, 734a 3r 30p; in Connaught, 1,078a 3r 25p; and in Munster, 539a 3r 15p. The tenement valuation in Ulster was £842 18s; in Leinster, £552 16s; in Connaught, £411 6s; and in Munster, £444. The former rent in Ulster was £913 3s 8d; in Leinster, £848 8s 10d; in Connaught, £446 14s 3d; and in Munster, £558 5s
