CORONER'S INQUEST.—Mr M. J. DeCourcy, City Coroner, with a jury, held an inquest at Back Clare street on Thursday, touching the death of Margaret Herbert, a widow, aged 65 years. It appears that she went to the canal for water, and while getting it she overreached herself and fell in. Her cries attracted the attention of three men, who raised her out of the water, but the poor woman who was rather feeble, died some time afterwards from the shock. The jury found that death was accidental.
