THE GALE.

During the whole of Saturday night and up to
 twelve o'clock on Sunday morning a terrific gale
 from the southwest blew over Kildysart. It was
 accompanied by thunder and lightning, and heavy
 showers of hail. The destruction to house pro-
 perty was of the usual kind—bricks and slates
 falling in all directions. Numerous trees
 were uprooted in the locality. The outgoing s.s.
 Ardnamult, which had proceeded down the river
 as far as Tarbert, had to return to the Foynes
 roads; and a sailing boat loaded with grain, from
 Limerick to Kilrush, was stranded near Ahanish.
 It is not yet known whether any injury was done
 to her—COR.

The *Anthencum* says:—"One of the few remain-
 ing men who could give personal recollections of
 Gothe, Ch. Schuchardt, the printer, died at
 Geneva, on January 9. He was a native of Wal-
 mar, where he served as printer's apprentice, and
 used as a boS to carry proofs to the post. In the
 year 1848 Schuchardt was involved in the revolu-
 tionary turmoil, and fled to Switzerland, where he
 ultimately became head of the firm which printed
 the *Journal de Geneve* and several of the publica-
 tions of the many learned societies of French
 Switzerland. He worked also for not a few houses
 in Paris.
