

over on equal grounds in stipulated wages he was to receive in labour, skilled or unskilled. A Union was formed for the purpose of placing the worker in an advantageous position as regards his labour. The Union came into existence for the purpose of preventing the man from being compelled to take on work which he was fairly entitled to, or to be compelled to work for longer hours than was reasonable. This in the main continues upon which the Trades Unions have worked since their foundation. It is now learned that the combination of the Dockers and the public recognize that the workers are relieved from the evils of "sweating." There has been a new class of Unionists, who have taken their operations still further, and have adopted a novel method for settling the settlement between capital and labour, and the apparent advantage of the latter, and the hours of labour being suitably settled, a new device is being introduced, which wages may for a time be proposed to diminish the supply of labour in view of the scarceness of the labour, and the price of it will proportionally increase. Burns and the new Unionists propose that more labourers shall be admitted into the Union or allowed to work in the Dockers, a combination which will pay a rate of pay may be improved.
