MR WILLIAM OBRIEN AND THE PREMIER.

The Court of Appeal to-day, consisting of the Master of the Rolls and Justices Fry and Lopes, had before them the appeal of Mr Wm O'Brien, M.P., in his action for alleged slander against Lord Salisbury in a speech delivered by him at Watford. The action was tried at Manchester, and a verdict for defendant was given. An application to the Divisional Court for a new trial was refused; hence the present action. Mr Gully for the appellant, urged that the jury should have found for the plaintiff.

A long legal argument took place as to the construction put upon the language of Mr O'Brien by Lord Salisbury.

Mr Gully admitted that Mr O'Brien advocated boycotting, but denied that he favoured or incited to crime and outrage.
