SAD DROWNING ACCIDENT AT KILKEE.—On Tuesday, while the students of the Redemptorist Order, who are staying at Kilkee were bathing in a cove which had been recommended them, and where they had often bathed previously, an enormous tidal wave came in suddenly and unperceived, and carried out Charles M'Sweeney, youngest son of Mr P. J. M'Sweeney, T.C., of this city. One of the priests who were present, and one of the senior students endeavoured to go to his assistance, and his brother student had actually reached the poor little fellow, when a second wave broke over, and separated them, and the boy was carried out to sea and drowned. An affecting incident connected with the sad accident is, that when his brother student reached the boy he was perfectly conscious and praying. The same wave which carried the boy out cast his brave attempted rescuer upon the beach, exhausted from his exertions. The little fellow was one of the best swimmers of the band, and was only thirteen years old. Deep and wide sympathy is felt for his family to whom so unexpected and terrible a grief has come.
