**DEATH OF MR. DANIEL O'CONNOR.**—We regret to announce the death, from bronchitis, of Mr Daniel O'Connor, Upper Williamstreet, at the age of 65 years. The deceased gentleman was for several years a member of the Corporation, and for some time past filled an important position in connection with the Gas Works. He possessed a kindly and courteous manner, which won for him the esteem of all with whom he came in contact, publicly or privately. The interment took place to-day at Mount St Lawrence Cemetery, and the funeral was very large and representative. The Mayor, High Sheriff, and various members of the Corporation were amongst those present. Messrs M'Carthy and Son were the undertakers.

**THE CASE OF MICHAEL O'BRIEN.**  
In the Queen's Bench yesterday, before Mr Justice Harrison, Mr Justice O'Brien, Mr Justice Murphy, and Mr Justice Holmes, Dr Falconer (instructed by Mr Baler) applied for a writ of *habeas corpus* in the case of Michael O'Brien, who was convicted at the Nenagh Assizes of the murder of his father-in-law, and who was sentenced to death. The object of the writ was to bring up O'Brien for the purpose of assigning error on his conviction. He was sentenced to be hanged on the 14th inst., but three days previously the Governor of Limerick Jail received an order from the Lord Lieutenant respiting the execution for three weeks.  
The Court granted the motion, and the writ was made returnable for Friday next.
