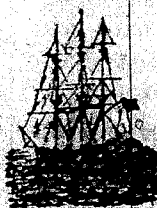

A WHALE OFF QUEENSTOWN HARBOUR.—The
steam-tug Mayflower, whilst returning to Queens-
town Harbour on Thursday morning, after towing
a vessel to Kinsale, sighted what was supposed to
be a small vessel floating bottom upwards. On
bearing down on the dark object it proved to be
a dead whale of large size. It had two very big
cuts across the back, where it was dreadfully
lacerated, such as would be produced by the pro-
peller of a transatlantic liner. The Mayflower
took the immense fish in tow, but was obliged to
abandon it five miles south-west of the Harbour
through its advanced state of decomposition.
